



MINISTRY POSITION

VIDEO EDITING

Time Commitment

Occasional individual projects that typically require 10-30 hours over 1-3 weeks. Actual times of day are flexible

Extra Commitment

Team meetings, training, and fellowship. Probably no more than 1.5 hours per month.

Synopsis

Video clips play a unique and expanding role in contemporary worship services. Video can capture a moment or express a point in experiential ways that mere words cannot duplicate. They can touch hearts during times of worship, and open the congregation's eyes to events around the church that they may never otherwise see. Our ability to use video in services is limited only by the availability of talented project leaders to create it. Project leaders are assigned an editing project on one of any of a variety of subjects (e.g., promoting a particular ministry, describing an event, or illustrating a teaching point), and from there use the available video, computer, and personnel resources to create the appropriate presentation. Project leaders must have a creative vision for the project, yet remain submissive to direction by the assigning leader, recognizing that the ultimate purpose of the project is to enhance that leader's ministry, not to showcase personal ability

Skills

Moderate-to-sophisticated computer skills and creativity. Some experience with camerawork and editing software is helpful, but eager neophytes willing to learn will also be considered

Training

Video Toaster editing software, video cameras, ongoing training in capture techniques for audio and video footage

Responsibilities

Taking initiative to organize people and equipment necessary to film a project. Work with assigning leader to create a script and storyline. Put in sometimes long hours on a compressed timeframe to create a quality piece in the editing phase. Maintain contact with assigning leader throughout process, and make any suggested changes
